Sentrillion provides professional training support services. We use the Sharable Content Object Reference Model (SCORM) standard that was initiated by Executive Order to promote and encourage the development of online adult training systems for both government and non-government organizations. Our training packages are portable between Learning Content Management Systems (LCMS) and utilize the same standard. Sentrillion's current training site (hosted by ez-lcms) is third generation SCORM compliant (version 1.2).
